



2017 Walk, Ride, and Roll to School Mini-Grant recipients

- **Audubon K – 8** will host a Commuting Safety Rally to educate students on active transportation and pedestrian safety. Middle School students will receive training from skilled bike riders, and will then plan a commute course on campus to teach the Elementary students.
- **Beautiful PB** will expand existing bike safety efforts by hosting monthly Walk, Bike, and Roll to School events, an organized group ride led by certified instructors teaching students how to safely travel to school through local streets, and a banner design contest.
- **Boys & Girls Club of Vista** will enhance the Project FUN (Fitness, Understanding, Nutrition) Walking Program to track and provide incentives to students walking or biking from local schools.
- **Cajon Valley Union School District** will partner with Rady Children's Hospital Safe Routes to School Program to host a Walk and Roll Week at three local schools, provide bike rodeo events, and safety presentations.
- **Cardiff Elementary School** will host Walk or Bike to School Wednesdays to encourage active transportation to school, starting with a kickoff assembly to educate students about pedestrian and bike safety.
- **Carmel Creek School** will encourage students and parents to take active transportation to school by hosting monthly Walk, Ride, and Roll to School days, a bike rodeo, and installing a bike rack for students to safely park bikes and scooters.
- **Chollas-Mead Elementary School** will host two Walk to School Day events, lead offsite walking school buses, and provide incentives to students taking active transportation to school.
- **Encinitas Union School District** will purchase crosswalk safety equipment to enable district students to walk to a satellite campus that encourages active transportation and healthy lifestyle habits.

- **Juarez-Lincoln Elementary School** will install a bike rack to increase safe storage space for bikes, and host a bike safety rodeo and quarterly Stroll and Roll days to encourage students to walk and bike to school on a regular basis.
- **Knox Middle School** will implement the Knox Helmet Safety Initiative to educate students on the importance of wearing a helmet, require helmet use, and provide helmets to students without access.
- **Logan Elementary School** will host a Walk and Bike to School Day, a bike rodeo event, and install a bike rack for students to safely store bikes on campus.
- **Mission Estancia Elementary School** will post neighborhood signs to designate safe routes to school for their Walk, Bike and Roll to School Week, and incentivize daily participation to students taking active transportation to school.
- **National School District** will partner with Rady Children’s Hospital San Diego Safe Routes to School to implement a National City Walks program at ten local elementary schools, providing pedestrian safety education and incentives for students walking to school.
- **San Diego VeloYouth** will partner with Hoover High School to, host a bike rodeo event, a bike maintenance class, and set up a bike train in a safe location away from traffic for students biking to school.
- **Torrey Hills Elementary School** will purchase a bike rack for students to safely store bikes on campus, and offer incentives to students who Walk, Ride, or Roll to school on a weekly basis.
